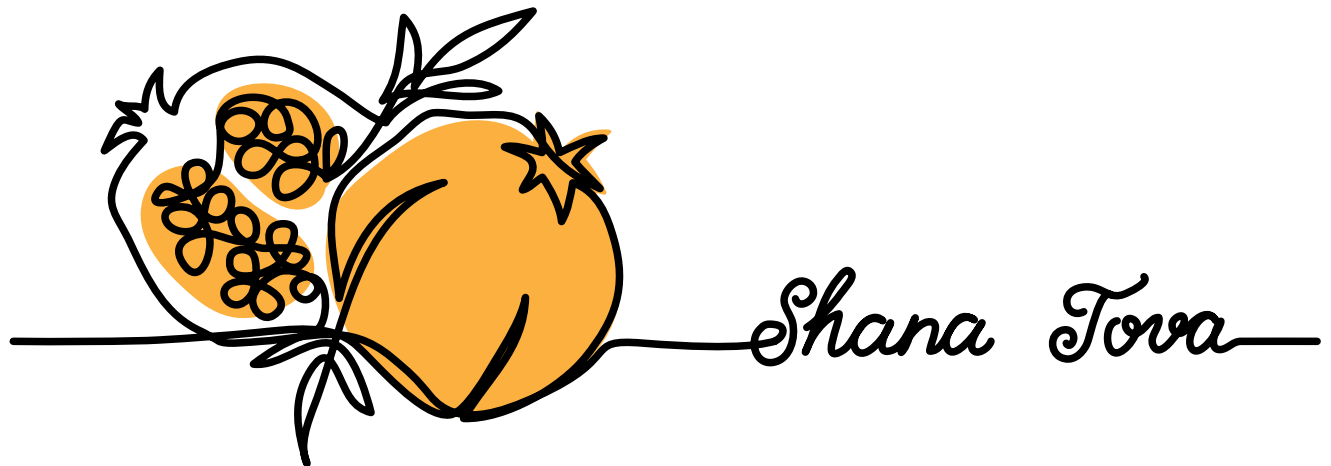
# High Holy Day Thoughts from Rabbi Greenberg

# DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

## MAIN SERVICE

Join Rabbi David Wilfond, Rabbi Emeritus David Greenberg, Rabbi MJ Newman, Kenny Green, Buddy Courtenay, Alli West, our cantorial soloists, and choir for our traditional High Holy Day service at 11:00am. Please note that we have timed all of our services (Young Family, Family and Teen) to allow time for parents and children to experience at least some part of our wonderful services.

## FAMILY SERVICE (GRADES 2-5)

We are pleased to offer a special service for families with children in grades 2 through 5 on both *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur* mornings. This will be a complete High Holy Day service, including a Torah service with readers from the congregation. This service is designed to be fulfilling both for parents and their children. We encourage families with children of the appropriate ages to worship together at this service.

## TEEN SERVICE (GRADES 6 THROUGH 12)

This is the coolest spot in town when our teens gather there on *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*. Great music and material that make kids think – this service has it all..

## YOUNG FAMILY SERVICE (PRE-K - 1ST GRADE))

Children in preschool through first grade and their parents are cordially invited to our Young Family Services on both *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*. The services are geared specifically for this age group. Interactive and engaging, these delightful services will enrich the High Holy Days experience for both parents and children.

## 2<sup>ND</sup> DAY ROSH HASHANAH SERVICE

Services on the 2nd day of *Rosh Hashanah*, led by Rabbi David Wilfond, take place at Caramoor.

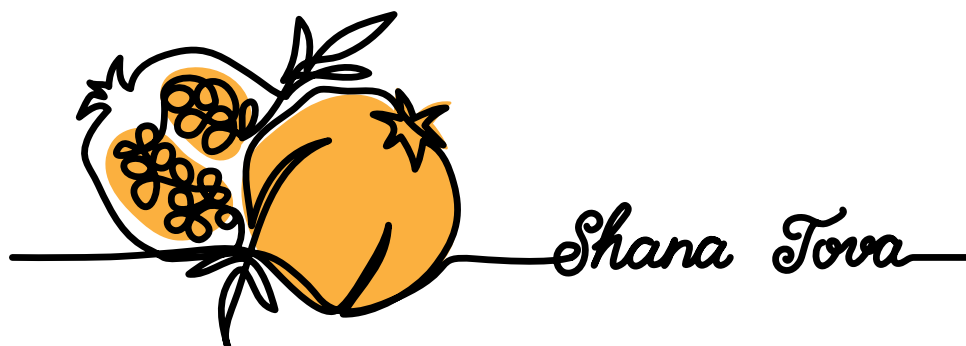
## YIZKOR SERVICE

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Welcome to High Holy Days at Temple Shaaray Tefila! We hope that your experience is a meaningful one. To maintain the sanctity and security of our services, and to ensure minimal inconvenience to worshippers, we have developed time-tested protocols you will see below.

Thank you for your help in making our services a safe and uplifting experience for everyone.

## TICKETS

- Printed tickets will be mailed for each person in your family (including children ages 5 through 30).
- The tickets are for both *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*, and includes the Family Services and 2nd Day *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yizkor*.
- Please be careful not to misplace these tickets and keep them for all the High Holy Days. If tickets are lost, a fee of \$18 per ticket will be charged to cover administrative and printing costs.
- If your child (under 30) is married, you may request an additional complimentary ticket.
- Every member of your family above the age of 5 must present a ticket at the gate for each service. Adults must have photo identification. No one will be admitted without a ticket and identification.
- Tickets are to be used only by the individual whose name appears on the tickets. No ticket may be transferred to another individual.
- For your convenience, the complete schedule of High Holy Day services is printed on your tickets.
- If you wish to purchase additional tickets, see pages 12 and 13 for ticket and ordering information.



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## PARKING

Having hundreds of cars park quickly and safely is a big challenge. Please help us in the following ways:

- Plan to arrive before services begin. In the event of inclement weather, it becomes even more essential that you arrive early as there is no covered area in which to wait while checking in.
- Handicapped parking is available.
- A 5782 Parking Pass will be included with your tickets. This is valid for ALL services. Please do not discard it after *Rosh Hashanah*.
- Please limit one car per family. Only one Parking Pass is issued per family. Families taking more than one car to Caramoor must show their High Holy Day tickets to gain entry into the parking lot.
- The Parking Pass should be displayed on the driver side of your dashboard. Those who do not have a pass must stop and show their tickets to the security officer at the entrance. In light of our enhanced security procedures, those without a pass or tickets will be denied entry WITHOUT EXCEPTION.



## SEATING

To facilitate the seating in the Main Tent and in the Family Service Tent, we ask that you please observe the following seating requests:

- As your family takes their seats, please do NOT save seats for friends and family members.
- If you have a part in a particular service, please either sit in the first 5 rows towards the front, or move forward 5 minutes before your part, when you'll go onto the Bima.



## DECORUM

- Parents, please speak to your children about the behavior expected of them during High Holy Day services and supervise them while at Caramoor.
- No one is allowed to climb trees, destroy plants, or pick flowers on the Caramoor grounds.
- Running around the tents, and loud and raucous play are also not appropriate.
- Electronic devices may not be used in any of the tents. Use of such devices in the fields outside of the tents is also discouraged.
- While we encourage children to meet with their friends before and after services, we discourage the playing of cards and other games.
